Higher Education, Apprenticeships & The Future: Useful Links

Students are strongly encouraged to cast a wide net and to explore all of the options available to them before they commit to a Post-18 pathway. In many cases, our students apply for university but also seek out apprenticeship options in the same area. Some of our students are adamant that one route is their only pathway and they then dedicate their effort to completing their university or apprenticeship application. Students wishing to enter the workplace are encouraged to follow the 'apprenticeship pathway' in terms of completing their covering letter, CV, requesting their reference and accessing support from their tutor.
