Every year, the Sir Isaac Newton Lecture takes place at RAF Cranwell. The talk is organised by the Institution of Engineering and Technology, the Royal Aeronautical Society and the Institution of Mechanical Engineers. The event is aimed at students to give them an insight into Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics, hopefully both inspiring them and broadening their awareness of the many varied and exciting careers in these fields.


This year, the talk will take place on Tuesday 9 October 2018. The lecture this year is 'What's Next - How Science is Shaping Our Future' and will be presented by Jim Al-Khalili OBE. Jim is a British scientist, author and broadcaster. He is a professor of Physics at the University of Surrey where he also holds a chair in the Public Engagement in Science.

The lecture is free although a small amount of money is required by students attending to cover the cost of the coach. The cost is £3 per student and this can be paid using the ParentPay system.

We will leave school at approximately 10am and return around 1pm in time for afternoon lessons. I would suggest that students take a packed lunch as they may return to school too late to purchase lunch from the Chill. Students should wear their usual school uniform.
