After the success of last year's event, Kesteven and Sleaford High School is hosting its second annual Astronomy evening. They are delighted to have continued support from the East Lincolnshire Astronomy Society and the Society will deliver a presentation about astronomy - including their experiences, the equipment used, how you can get involved yourself, and much more. With this year being 50 years since the Moon landing there will be a focus on Lunar astronomy within the presentation. Weather permitting, there will then be an opportunity to observe the night's sky, hopefully with good views of the Moon, Jupiter and Saturn. We are happy for each student to bring a parent/carer with them - please state on the reply slip if you wish to do so.
