Dear Parent/Carer

Staff, students and parents have been working hard over the last few weeks in extraordinary circumstances and I feel that we are all beginning to feel the strain. Feedback from our wellbeing surveys suggest that this is the case. Some students are reporting that they are finding that a lot of work is being set, or that limited or shared IT access means they cannot always complete as much as they are being encouraged to do. Whilst it is very hard to judge remotely the right length of tasks for all students please be assured that we are addressing this with staff. Please just let your child know that they are only expected to do what they can but that they should be tackling some school work every day as part of their lockdown routine. We continue to advise them to roughly follow their normal timetables in order to maintain a broad and balanced study plan, but they do not need to be working for five hours a day.

I suggest that we use the weekend as an opportunity to step away from the school work and enjoy time together without feeling the need to do any work and as a result the school will not be open this Bank Holiday Friday, 8 May. Provision the following week for children of key workers will be at Kesteven and Sleaford High School. Digital Access

We are aware that many of our students are in households where there is limited access to a computer and have applied through the Government scheme for laptops to support students currently in Year 10 who qualify for Free School Meals.

Year 11 into Sixth Form Transition

Work for Year 11 students planning to study at any of the Sleaford Joint Sixth Form (SJSF) sites is now live and available via the SJSF website <u>www.sleafordjsf.org/transition-packs</u>. Staff have set slightly more work than in previous years to ensure that students cover any missed work from their GCSE courses, so they are fully prepared for Level 3 courses.
